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Itinerary:

Day 1, April 2 Saturday: Arrival - Introduction to the Tour

Arrive in Israel and transfer on your own to your hotel. MEJDI can assist with arranging private transportation from the airport to your hotel.

Day 2, April 3 Sunday: Negev

Make your way down to the **Negev** visiting a few sites along the way. Begin with a stop at either **Ivri Cheese Farm** or **Dairy Goats Reckless** where visitors can come close to the animals and enjoy the local Cheese. Continue to **Tel Azekah**, enjoy the beautiful scenery and biblical stories before heading to a couple of **Ella Valley's Wineries** for tastings. Then, heading south, make another stop at **Desert Daughter** OR visit with **Kornmehl Farm**. Finally overlook the Ramon Crater and check-in to your hotel.
